Study Plan of the *Regulation and Behavioural Studies* program

Study Plan

At the beginning of their studies, each student shall, in cooperation with their supervisor, draw up their individual study plan (ISP), which shall represent subjects required to complete the studies and which are subject

to approval by the doctoral study programme's council. The ISP shall include:

- compulsory subjects defining the theoretical-methodological basis of the programme,
- optional subjects,
- voluntary subjects.

1. Compulsory Subjects (with a subsidy of 15 credits for each subject):

Economics and Regulation

Research Methodology

Applied economic theory and experiments

2. Optional Subjects (with a subsidy of 10 credits for each subject, the student must choose 2 subjects):

Behavioral economics

Global changes and strategic management

Human behaviour and decisions in spatial perspective

Computational experiments in experimental economics

Human behavior

Evaluation of state interventions

Eye tracking in pedagogical practice

The student may complete at least 2 obligatory subjects in the doctoral study programme pursuant to their choice, in compliance with their profile and focus of the doctoral thesis.

3. Optional subjects:

The student may select the maximum of two other voluntary subjects at the UJEP or another higher-education institution in the Czech Republic or abroad, enabling them to supplement and deepen their knowledge pursuant to their needs.

This selection shall be approved by the doctoral study programme guarantor and subsequently by the doctoral study programme council. The student may collect for each voluntary subject a maximum of 5 credits.

Potential changes to the student's ISP are subject to approval by the doctoral study programme council.
